Bremerton Raceway Racers:

Halloween is over. Thanksgiving is in three weeks. Christmas is right around the corner. Time to get ready for the 2020 season at Bremerton Raceway.

The Awards Banquet is December 7 at the Bethel Grange Hall, located at 5998 Bethel Rd SE, Port Orchard, WA 98367. Potluck dinner at 6pm. Bring your own beverage.

The tentative 2020 schedule has been released. We start racing Easter Weekend. The Puyallap Corvette show that was in February has been cancelled. Pacific Raceways is doing a swap meet February 7 through the 9th. We will have a booth there.

Chassis inspections and Extended Technical Inspections has been scheduled for March 7 at the Bremerton Airport parking lot.

We have some new things for 2020. We have changed the Season Points Series. There are seventeen (17) scheduled points races. Only fourteen (14) will count for the championship. This way a racer can miss a race and not negatively affect their chance at the championship. If a racer does attend all 17 races, his worst three will be thrown out.

The ET Bracket finals will be at Woodburn in 2020. Future finals location will depend on factors discussed at the track operators meeting in January.

We have started a separate High School series. This series will be held on Friday night. The champion will be recognized at the 2020 awards banquet. This is separate series from the regular High School series. Only the regular High School series racer will be considered for the ET Finals. The Friday night series is designed to give high school racers a place to race and practice for the regular series.

The John Kilroy Footbrake Challenge and Mike Sarver Memorial Shootout is looking to do a three-day race. The Sears Family has indicated they want to expand, so I have scheduled it as a weekend event. If the Sunday race does not materialize, we will do something that Sunday. We are also looking at doing a golf kart race on that Friday.

No National Open in 2020, but the Malarkey Super Quick Series and the Infinity Coach Junior Championship Series will return September 12 and 13.

Car Club Challenge returns for seven events and a couple of other clubs have expressed an interest. The Vintage Motorcycle group was one of them. I know I liked watching them race when they came out in 2019.

And one more thing. I got together with Pacific Raceways and we have come up with a Bremerton/Pacific Challenge Series for 2020. Each track has designated 3 races for the series. A racer must join at least one of the tracks points series. Each racer must race at least one race at each track. The six races will count for an overall champion in Sportsman, Pro, Super Pro, and Motorcycle. The Bremerton dates are May 17, June 21, and August 9. The Pacific dates are May 26, June 13, and August 29. This series is to promote cooperation between our two racetracks.

Ok I guess I am done rambling. Off to Pomona for the world finals.
